USEPA/MDEQ CERTIFICATION OF XPERIENTIAL LABORATORIES

Xperiential Laboratories, a division of Somnio Global LLC, recently became provisionally certified to perform inorganic chemistry testing on drinking water samples by the USEPA and the Michigan Department of Environmental Quality under



Laboratory Number 9015. Such certification involves successfully analyzing unknown proficiency test samples as well as undergoing an inspection by Michigan Department



of Environmental auditor. Dr. Calvin Austin is their Laboratory Director.

The laboratory has now become an official testing site to determine levels of antimony, arsenic, barium, beryllium, cadmium, chromium,

lead, nickel, selenium, thallium, copper, mercury, nitrate, nitrite, and fluoride in drinking water. The majority of the metals are determined using ICP-MS instrumentation (Inductively Coupled Plasma - Mass Spectrometer) and


